

Photographing with Vintage and Toy Cameras

We will be using plastic "toy" cameras that are made to hold either 35mm or, preferably, 120 (medium format) film. The most popular plastic camera and the one I recommend is the Holga 120N, which is available from Freestyle Photo & Imaging Supplies. An alternative to the Holga camera could be a vintage camera such as an old box camera or Twin Lens camera.

In addition, you will want to purchase:

- 4 rolls of traditional B&W film (Ilford HP5 120 or Kodak Tri-X 120 is the best option to use with the Holga 120N)
- 25-sheet pack of 8x10 Ilford Multigrade Deluxe RC paper in either Glossy or Pearl surface
- Old towel
- 3-ring notebook/binder for negatives
