On the first day of class you will be assembling a plein air watercolor kit with your supplies, and we will get familiar with them indoors. Be creative and use what you have! I do not expect everyone to buy all brand-new materials, but if you're unsure about your existing supplies, consult me ahead of time with questions and ideas! My own kit is not fancy or new.

Remember you will be outside! Prepare for the weather and keep in mind you will be carrying everything you need. You also may want a very small pillow to sit on, sunscreen, a hat, or whatever you need to be comfy!

Hot tips...Michael's has coupons on their website always, and we have a secondhand supply store called Who Gives a Scrap where you might get lucky! I based the prices in this list on buying 100% new supplies at Michaels.

Supplies

Set of 5 synthetic watercolor paint brushes (These do not have to be fancy!)	\$10
Basic watercolor paints. I recommend a travel pan set!	\$20
A watercolor pad of paper, preferably spiral bound, smaller than 8x10	\$15
Small CORE brand water bottle, found at gas stations, Walmart, etc. (The cap acts as a travel paint water cup, same concept as a thermos!)	\$5
Mechanical pencil of any kind, 0.7mm or smaller	\$3
Some sort of organization or carrying device. You can get fancy plein air travel kits that act as mini easels, or you can throw your supplies in a bag.	

Total estimated cost: \$53 (if you buy everything new)
