

## Dare to Oil Paint!

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Oil paint is hard to get off clothes so please bring an apron or something to protect your clothes.

There are hundreds of brushes and bristle types to choose from but don't get overwhelmed if you are just starting out, any oil brushes natural or synthetic will work. (Can look at Artist Loft or Princton brands at Michaels). I list two brush sizes in the supply list below for affordability, but a small, medium, and larger brush would be great to have. I like working with an angled brush to allow for different thicknesses in my mark making.

I suggested a wooden, glass, or paper palette for mixing but for cost efficiency you can wrap any flat surface in aluminum foil.

## **Supplies**

One 16" x 20" canvas board	\$10
Variety of oil paint brushes #3 and #6	\$6.99-\$20
Turpentine or mineral spirits as a paint thinner (odorless preferred)	\$6
Refined Linseed Oil (optional)	\$6
Glass Jar (Cleaning Brushes)	\$1
Pallet (Wood, Glass, or Paper Pallet)	\$8.99
Titanium White tube of oil paint	\$7
Ivory Black tube of oil paint	\$7

Total estimated cost \$54.00 (including optional material)
