

Beginning Micro Torch Soldering

Safety first, please wear closed toe shoes, no loose long sleeves, bring eye protection (your regular eyeglasses are fine), and all long hair must be worn back. Be prepared to get a little dirty!

The tools and supplies listed below are just suggestions; if you already have something similar, please don't feel you need to purchase new. The items in red you MUST have on the first day of class. The items in black below are the wonderful to have. I have some of these items to share, but not enough for the whole class, so please bring them if you have them. Cheaper is always better when you're starting out!

\$20 materials fee due to instructor on the first day of class. This will cover the silver patterned wire for the ring we will make as well as pickle, polishing pads, etc. Don't freak out at the supply cost! Hopefully you have already started your jewelry journey and have many of the items, or similar items! Any of these items that can be purchased from Rio Grande Jewelry Supply, I will be sending out a discount code a week prior to class so you can purchase things at my rate.

Jewelry Making Pliers , both round nose and straight nose- My favorites are Xuron round nose and flat nose if possible. You can find them at Amazon or Hobby Lobby	\$15
Jewelry Wire Cutters – again my favorite are Xuron Brand for cutting silver wire, Hobby Lobby or Amazon	\$15
Hardware Wire Cutters - from your toolbox to cut the solder wire (don't want use your good jewelry cutters for that)	or \$0

- Chasing Hammer Jewelry Hammer Get one that is NOT Flat Faced. Beadsmith a good one. Hobby Lobby or Amazon https://a.co/d/5dOfSZa
- Bench Block if you have one, I will have one we can share https://a.co/d/ggl0vZJ
- Hardware, regular old boring Hammer for flattening your solder wire (don't want to mess up your nice jewelry hammer). Hopefully found in the junk drawer, or your toolbox

- **Ring Mandrel** if you have one, I will bring some to share too
- Jewelry Files , 2 "strengths" "2nd Cut" Harshest File we will use (Cut 2) and "Smooth" Cut (Cut 4). Amazon, Rio Grande. You can spend a lot on these, the cheap \$8 ones from Amazon are fine. I have "Grobet" brand, there are several other brands on the web I just haven't used them & don't know how good they are. I like the half round because they also fit/work inside rings. Double use. I will have some to share, but please feel free to bring what you have
