## Faceting Pottery

Supplies are available at Michaels, Hobby Lobby, Menninger's, Amazon, etc. Please bring old apron and clothes you don't mind getting dirty, as well as a large towel.

I purchased my cheese cutter from King Soopers for about \$10-\$12. Purchase a 9" Dirty Girls wiggle wire (optional) from stone leaf (Aurora, CO) or other pottery tool distributors. I'd recommend watching demonstrations with this tool to see if you're interested. **I will have stretched out springs for \$1-\$2, that can be used in place of a wiggle wire.**

Basic Safety and Guidelines:

Please cut nails as short as possible before class begins (this means VERY short) and hair past the shoulder must be tied up to prevent injury while operating wheel.
