

Live Model: Portrait Painting

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Oil paint is hard to get out of clothes so please bring an apron or something to protect your clothes.

There are hundreds of brushes and bristle types to choose from but don't get overwhelmed if you are just starting out, any oil brushes that are natural or synthetic will work. You can look at Artist Loft or Princton brands at Micheals.

I list two brush sizes in the supply list below for affordability, but a small, medium, and larger brush would be great to have. I like working with an angled brush to allow for different thicknesses in my mark making.

Supplies

I suggested a wooden, glass or paper pallet for mixing but for cost efficiency you can wrap any flat surface in aluminum foil.

Free, if brought from home

11" x 14" Canvas/ Canvas board (if you like working larger 16"x20"	\$10
Variety of oil paint brushes #3 and #6	\$6.99-\$20
Turpentine or mineral spirits as a paint thinner (odorless preferred)	\$6
Refined Linseed Oil (optional)	\$6
Glass Jar (Cleaning Brushes)	\$1
Pallet (Wood, Glass, or Paper Pallet)	\$8.99
Pallet Knife (small to medium)	\$2.99

Student pack of oil paints (limited color pallet its fine) - <u>Suggested oil colors</u>: Ivory Black, Titanium white, Cadmium Red, Lemon Yellow, Yellow Ochre, Burt Sienna, Burnt Umber, Alizarin Crimson, Viridian Green, Ultramarine Blue. This one is an economical place to start:
