

## Wheel Thrown Planters

Supplies are available at Michaels, Hobby Lobby, Menninger's, Amazon, etc. Please bring an old apron and or old bath towel and clothes you don't mind getting dirty. I purchased my Cheese cutter from King Soopers for about \$10-12. I'd recommend watching demonstrations with this tool to see if you're interested. Other supplies can be found through various online vendors.

If you desire to work on jars, please purchase calipers.

If you desire to work on composite forms, please purchase at least two plastic bats and calipers. You may purchase your own bat pins, but we have sets at Bemis and I will bring extra to class.

If you desire to work on faceting or fluting, please purchase a cheese cutter, fluting tool, and/or a wiggle wire. I will have stretched out springs that are used as a wiggle wire so you can save yourself money and try the spring before buying the wire.

## **Basic Safety and Guidelines:**

Please cut nails as short as possible before class begins (this means VERY short) and hair past the shoulder must be tied up to prevent injury while operating wheel from occurring.

## **Supplies**

8-piece pottery tool set	\$13.99
Wire Cheese Cutter (for faceting, optional)	\$10-\$20
Paddle (optional)	\$13-\$20
Kemper Hole Cutter Punch 1/4"-HCP2 (optional, I have one I'll bring to class)	\$5
Kemper COR cutout tool (optional, a needle tool can be used)	\$6
Calipers (for measuring base diameter of pot so water dish can fit, optional but recommended)	\$4-\$13
Bat Pins	\$5
<u>Plastic Bats</u> is affordable and good, size of bat will determine how wide you can make your planter.	

Buying 2 is recommended but it is optional. We have bats at Bemis)
