
Portraits With Tempera Paint and Acrylic Paint

The supplies suggested below are from Hobby Lobby, but are also available at Michaels, Menninger's, Blick's, Amazon, etc. **Acrylic Paint:** If you can afford Cadmium red and Yellow not as a hue, you will get better mixing results, but they are more expensive. The most important colors you should have are the primary colors red, blue, and yellow, and Titanium white – from these colors, you can mix most colors.

Brushes: Brushes for acrylic paint work best if they have synthetic fibers, and are fairly stiff. A variety of both flat and pointed are good in sizes large, medium, and small. **Canvases:** I recommend larger Canvases for the acrylic painting. I think 16 x 20 inches is good size. They can be canvas boards or stretched canvases. **Paint Palette:** An old glass or Pyrex pie dish makes an excellent traveling paint palette. Styrofoam or plastic plates also work. You can also use a clear-cutting matt. If you already have a designated palette, that works too.

*Please feel free to use any supplies you already have as long as you have the primary colors and titanium white.

*Acrylic paint leaves a permanent mark on clothing, so please bring an apron or wear clothing that you don't mind getting paint on, as well as an old towel or paper towels for whipping brushes.
